## A HANDY GUIDE to the player and banker.

Baccarat is a game of chance in which you place a bet on which of two hands, the "Player" or the "Banker," will end up a higher point total - or a tie.

You don't make any decisions about how cards are played. The only decisions are what outcomes to bet on and how much to bet.

## THREE OUTCOMES

Cards are dealt face up in front of the dealer in two hands, the Player and the Banker. There are three possible outcomes to bet on:


The Player Hand is higher.
(2) The Banker Hand is higher.
(3) The Player and Banker Hands tie.

## PEARL OF GAMESENSE

Squeezing or folding your cards can be a fun ritual, but you can't change the odds of winning.

Several variations of Baccarat exist.
Here are some types you may see:

## CHEMIN DE FER

The participant offering to bet the most becomes the Banker and is responsible for dealing the cards. That person must bet on the Banker Hand.

## MIDIBACCARAT

The participant betting the most on either hand announces the point total for that hand.

## MINI-BACCARAT

Participants are not allowed to touch the cards.

## Let's play

1 Place your bet on the Player Hand, the Banker Hand, or a Tie.

2 Once bets are placed, two cards are dealt to both the Player and the Banker.

3 A point count is determined by adding the two cards. If the total is a two-digit number, then the first digit is dropped. For example, a value total of 12 would have a point total of 2).

4 If either the Player or the Banker Hand is 8 or 9 , this is called a 'natural' and the round ends.

5 The Player Hand gets a third card if its first two cards total 0 to 5 . If its total is 6 or 7, it does not get a third card.
6 If the Player did not receive a third card: The Banker gets a third card if its first two cards totalled 0 to 5. The Banker stands on 6 and 7.

7 If the Player did receive a third card: The Banker's Hand gets a third card based on the following table:

| Total of Banker's <br> first two cards | The Banker takes a <br> third card if the <br> Player's third card is |
| :---: | :---: |
| 0,1 or 2 | Any card |
| 3 | Not an 8 |
| 4 | 2 through 7 |
| 5 | 4 through 7 |
| 6 | 6 or 7 |
